Know Before You Go / Entry Policies & Fan Code of Conduct

When attending games, the “Game Viewing Contract Terms and Conditions” established by the Nippon Professional Baseball Organization (NPB) and The Yomiuri Shimbun shall apply, along with the World Baseball Classic Ticket Terms and Conditions available at <https://www.mlb.com/world-baseball-classic/tickets/terms#japan-ja>.

We kindly ask that you also comply with the “Entry Policies & Fan Code of Conduct” set forth below.

With respect to prohibited items, cheering equipment, etc., the “Stadium Rules” established by Tokyo Dome, Kyocera Dome Osaka, Hinata Sun Marine Stadium Miyazaki, and SOKKEN Stadium (collectively, the “Stadium Operators”) shall take precedence.

■ Persons Who Will Be Denied Entry

- Members of organized crime groups or similar antisocial organizations, or individuals closely associated with such groups.
- Persons prohibited or denied entry by the event organizer, the stadiums, or the Professional Baseball Organized Crime Exclusion Countermeasure Council.
- Persons without a valid admission ticket.
- Persons who refuse to cooperate with bag checks, metal detector screening, beverage inspections, etc., upon entry.
- Persons who are excessively intoxicated.
- Other individuals specified in the “Match Viewing Contract Terms” or those deemed inappropriate for entry by the organizer or the stadiums.

For the comfort and safety of all, fans are prohibited to enter the stadium with the following hazardous or potentially disruptive items. WORLD BASEBALL CLASSIC INC., the Yomiuri Shimbun, and the stadiums reserve the right at any time to adjust entry policies at their sole discretion without any prior notice.

■ Prohibited Items in the Stadiums (Items Not Allowed Inside)

*Note: All belongings are subject to search.

- Firearms, knives, fireworks, explosives, toxic substances, or other dangerous items.
- Items that may disturb other spectators (e.g., items emitting strong odors or loud noises)
- Glass bottles, cans
- Plastic bottles
 - Tokyo Dome / Hinata Sun Marine Stadium Miyazaki / SOKKEN Stadium: Plastic bottles over 1,000 ml or frozen plastic bottles.

- Kyocera Dome Osaka: Plastic bottles over 1,000 ml.
- Animals (except certified service animals or service animals in training)
- Items intended for excessive seat reservation
- Items other than those specified under “Support Equipment” below, and apparel that includes content prohibited under “Apparel” below.
- Large luggage exceeding the personal seat area

*Note: Stroller Policy (Venue-Specific)

- Tokyo Dome: Strollers may not be brought into or used inside the stadium. Please use the designated stroller check area outside the stadium.
- Kyocera Dome Osaka: Storage spaces are available near each gate; however, strollers must be stored under the guest’s own responsibility.
- Hinata Sun Marine Stadium Miyazaki / SOKKEN Stadium: Strollers are permitted, but must be stored so as not to disturb other guests.
- Suitcases (regardless of size)
- Aerosol cans (e.g., hairspray, pepper spray, etc.)
- Baseball bats
- Beach balls or other inflatables
- Coolers
- Laser devices or pointers
- Noisemaking devices (i.e., air horns, cowbells, etc.) — excluding megaphones for cheering, cheering bats within the size limits specified under “Support Equipment” below, and any items permitted by the organizer and/or the Stadium Operators.
- Skateboards and rollerblades
- Sticks or clubs exceeding 25” in size
- Toy guns or knives (including water guns)
- Unmanned Aerial Vehicles (drones)
- Items that the organizer or Tokyo Dome deems to be dangerous or may cause a disturbance to the event or facility management or items that may cause a disturbance to other customers as specified in the Match Viewing Contract Terms and Conditions.

*Note: You may be denied entry if you bring prohibited items. Please use nearby coin lockers or similar facilities for storage.

■ Food, Alcohol and Other Beverage Regulations

*Note: Alcoholic beverages may not be brought into the stadiums. There is no transfer service for prohibited bottles, cans, or plastic bottles.

- Tokyo Dome / Hinata Sun Marine Stadium Miyazaki / SOKKEN Stadium:

- Outside food is permitted inside the venue (excluding prohibited items such as cans). Food items that can interfere with others' viewing or disrupt the pleasant stadium environment (such as foods with strong smells, are soupy, etc.) are not permitted into the stadium.
- Kyocera Dome Osaka:
 - Please refrain from bringing outside food and beverages into the venue. *(However, plastic bottles of 1,000 ml or less are permitted.)*

■ Prohibited Actions

- Violent behavior (e.g., abusive language, threats, intimidation, extortion, or physical violence).
- Damaging or vandalizing facilities or equipment.
- Throwing objects into the seating areas, concourses, the field, or other areas.
- Reserving spaces in lines before staff form queues (the organizer is not responsible for self-formed or spontaneously formed lines or space reservations using tape or luggage).
- Entering restricted or prohibited areas, including the field, clubhouses, and other back of house credentialed areas.
- Climbing or hanging on dugouts, fences, barriers, handrails, or nets.
- Hanging balls, boards, or other items from fences or handrails to solicit autographs from players.
- Demanding money or other benefits from spectators for securing seats, cheering, or game-watching purposes.
- Unauthorized sales, leaflet distribution, or surveys without the approval of the organizer or the stadiums.
- Watching the game from areas other than those indicated on your ticket or moving to empty reserved seats.
- Viewing from evacuation routes, including aisles, stairways, and entrances.
- Making excessive noise or disturbances inside or outside the venue.
- Excessively reserving seats in standing areas or general admission seats for personal use.
- Using flashlights, laser pointers, or similar items that may interfere with the game.
- Lighting up glowing support items (e.g., maracas or LED lights) during play.
- Using support equipment not specified under "Support Equipment" below, or wearing apparel that includes content prohibited under "Apparel" below.
- Throwing paper streamers, confetti, or jet balloons.
- Pursuing balls or other items in a manner that could harm other spectators.
- Wearing head coverings or using face paint that prevents facial identification.
- Engaging in overly disruptive cheering that disturbs others.
- Taking photographs of staff.
- The use of offensive language concerning another person's race, ethnicity, gender, religion, disability, age, sexual orientation or national origin ("Derogatory Language") by any fan, whether such language is directed at players, umpires or other spectators, managers, coaches, organizers and their staff, vendors, and other ballpark personnel, is unacceptable and inconsistent with the spirit of the game.

- Other actions specified in the “Game Viewing Contract Terms” or deemed disruptive, dangerous, or inappropriate by the organizer or Tokyo Dome for event operation and facility management.

*Note: Operating drones or other unmanned aerial vehicles over Tokyo Dome grounds and surrounding areas is prohibited under the Small Unmanned Aircraft Act. Violations will result in penalties as defined by law.

■ Support Equipment (Support Banners, Message Boards, etc.)

WORLD BASEBALL CLASSIC INC. and The Yomiuri Shimbun welcome banners, signs, and flags that celebrate the game of baseball, baseball players, and national and regional cultural heritage. This policy is to guarantee visibility during the game and limit distractions. Any banner or sign may be removed at the sole discretion of the officials, and the management reserves the right to restrict the presence of banners, signs, and flags in specific areas of the ballpark. Any banner, sign or flag used in a disruptive manner or inciting or disrupting other guests will be removed.

Please note that for the 2026 WBC, only official flags from participating countries and regions in the tournament are allowed.

Guests are permitted to bring and display banners, signs, and flags inside the ballpark between innings if they DO NOT:

- Contain wood, metal or other inflexible materials (light and flexible materials ONLY)
- Interfere with the game or other guests’ enjoyment of the game
- Obstruct existing ballpark signage
- Attach signs and/or banners to any ballpark wall, structure or pole of any sort
- Parade through any part of the ballpark
- Are not excessively decorated. (i.e., must not be excessively decorated)
- Include any of the following:
 - Be commercial in nature – NO signage or advertisements pertaining to personal businesses or other commercial entities not associated with WORLD BASEBALL CLASSIC INC. and The Yomiuri Shimbun.
 - Obscene – NO foul language or disrespectful statements
 - Be political in nature – NO statements regarding political affiliation or statements that undermine civil liberties).
- The following areas prohibit the display of banners, message boards, and similar items.
 - Tokyo Dome: INFIELD SSS for matches involving Japan and INFIELD SS for matches not involving Japan
 - Kyocera Dome Osaka: EXCELLENT SEAT
 - Hinata Sun Marine Stadium Miyazaki
 - ✓ 1st-base side: Rows 1–17, Seats 1–68
 - ✓ 3rd-base side: Rows 1–17, Seats 11–68
 - SOKKEN Stadium: Areas inside both dugouts (behind home plate / backstop area)

- You may not use support equipment outside your assigned seat.
- The size of permitted support equipment is as follows:

Support Banners	Up to 600 mm (H) × 600 mm (W) No Poles Allowed
Message Board	Up to 600 mm (H) × 600 mm (W) No Poles Allowed
Small Cheering Flags	Up to 600 mm (H) × 600 mm (W) <i>Kyocera Dome Osaka</i> : up to 600 mm (H) × 600 mm (W) Flagpole: up to 650 mm, one pole only <i>Kyocera Dome Osaka</i> : up to 700 mm
Cheering Megaphones and Cheering Bats	Up to 400 mm in length <i>Kyocera Dome Osaka</i> : up to 600 mm
Other Support Equipment	Up to approx. 700 mm (H) × 500 mm (W) <i>Kyocera Dome Osaka</i> : up to 600 mm × 600 mm

- Banners, noise-making devices (e.g., trumpets, drums, whistles, bells) are not permitted unless used by officially approved private cheering squads authorized under “Special Cheering Permission Rules” by the Professional Baseball Organized Crime Exclusion Countermeasure Council.
- Support equipment must not extend beyond your seating area.
- Even within the size limits, equipment may be prohibited if it disturbs other spectators.
- Support banners and message boards must be held by one person. Items held by two or more people will be considered “banners” and are prohibited.
- Support flags, banners, and message boards must promote the team or players. Items containing offensive, defamatory, or inappropriate content, as judged by the organizer, are prohibited.
- Other support equipment specified in the “Game Viewing Contract Terms” (Article 9) or deemed inappropriate by the organizer or the stadiums may not be used.

■ Apparel

- Guests are NOT permitted to wear anything that contains:
 - Obscene, hateful, violent/graphic, defamatory images or symbols
 - Foul language or disrespectful statements
 - Discriminatory images, symbols or statements that undermine civil liberties
 - Messages or images that incite or disrupt the game or guest experience
- Guests who use apparel to congregate and engage in disruptive behavior or to incite or disrupt other guests will be removed.

■ The Stadiums Are Completely Non-Smoking

The stadiums are entirely non-smoking. Smokers may use designated smoking areas outside the venue.

■ Re-Entry Policy

- Tokyo Dome:
 - Re-entry is allowed at all gates except Gates 11 and 22 until the end of the 7th inning.
 - Tickets are scanned out at the designated re-entry gates. If fans exit the venue from anywhere other than the designated re-entry gates after entering and do not get their ticket scanned out, their ticket will become invalid.
 - MLB Ballpark App tickets can be scanned at Gates 21, 22, and 31. Re-entry for Ballpark App tickets is allowed only at Gate 21 until the end of the 7th inning.
 - For re-entry, fans must pass through the walk-through metal detectors just as when entering, and any bags will be subject to inspection.
- Kyocera Dome Osaka:
 - Re-entry is available at all gates until the end of the game.
 - Tickets will be checked at the designated re-entry gates. If fans exit from any gate other than the designated re-entry gates, their ticket will become invalid.
 - Re-entry is subject to bag inspection, the same as upon entry.
- Hinata Sun Marine Stadium Miyazaki / SOKKEN Stadium
 - Re-entry is available until the end of the 7th inning.
 - Tickets will be checked at the designated re-entry gate.
 - Re-entry is subject to bag inspection, the same as upon entry.

*Common Reasons for Re-Entry

Re-entry may be used for the following reasons:

- To visit merchandise shops outside the stadium.
- To purchase food and beverages outside the stadium.
 - *However, at Kyocera Dome Osaka, please refrain from bringing outside food and beverages into the venue (except plastic bottles of 1,000 ml or less).*
- To smoke outdoors.
- To meet up with someone who arrived late for the game and escort them to the venue.
