We would like to announce that TeNQ reopened from the 1st of June,2020. However, in order to prevent the spread of infection of diseases such as Covid-19, we will shorten our opening hours and some attractions are not available. To reopen the museum, we will enhance sanitization, cleaning and any kinds of prevention with full attention, but we also would like to ask visitors for your understanding and cooperating following precautions. 2.Please confirm precautions below. If visitor do not agree or cooperate with them, we may refuse his/her admission.

- Visitors who has infected with COVID-19 or who has contacted with a patient infected with COVID-19 may be refused admission.
- Please do not enter TeNQ if you have spent time abroad in the last 14 days.
- Please do not enter the museum if you have or had cold symptoms (such as cough, fever, loss of smelling, etc.), extreme fatigue, and/or shortness of breath in last 2 weeks.

- Older adults and people who have severe underlying medical conditions like heart or lung disease or diabetes seem to be at higher risk for developing more serious complications from COVID-19 illness.
  We recommend to check the congestion of museum before your visit.
- Please wear a mask when you visit TeNQ. On "Family Day", children less than 3 years old can enter TeNQ without wearing a mask. We refuse admission of visitors who don't have or wear a mask.
- Before entering the museum, we will check your body temperature using a non-contact thermometer at the ticket counter.

If visitor's temperature is found to be over 37.5  $\,^{\circ}$ C, we may refuse admission.

- If symptoms such as coughing still do not stop after entering TeNQ, we may ask to leave TeNQ at the discretion of the facility manager.
- Please use a hand sanitizer in the museum. We would also like to ask visitors to wash your hands, gargle frequently, and cover your cough.
- Please keep a safe distance and do not speak in a loud voice in order to prevent an airborne infection.
- Please keep your tickets or receipts for 2weeks in order to verify your visit, when a visitor found to be infected.
